

## **KCCT Promotes Two to Firm Principal**

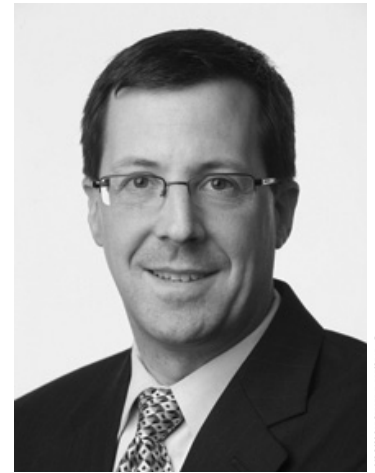
KCCT Architects recently promoted two Associates to Principals: Christopher L. Peoples, AIA and Paul Phillips, AIA, LEED® AP.

## **Project Awarded: Master Planning in Tegucigalpa**

The U.S. Department of State has contracted with KCCT to provide Master Planning services for a major rehabilitation of the U.S. Embassy Compound in Tegucigalpa, Honduras. The U.S. Embassy in Tegucigalpa is a multi-building complex on a dramatic hillside site with sweeping views of the city. The original Chancery was designed and constructed in the 1950s as a naturally ventilated building with open corridors and jalousie windows. For the master plan, KCCT will evaluate the rehabilitation requirements to ensure necessary standards and operational requirements are met while identifying phasing and construction schedules and related costs. To meet the changing needs of the mission, KCCT will develop hypothetical models for comparative analysis with the existing compound.
